Wrap your world in light

Tired of basic light bulbs and lighting fixtures? A Denver company is working to distribute a different type of technology to homes and businesses in the region. Evo-Lite Inc. sells a flat, flexible lighting material that can be used to design nearly anything from signs to disco floors. The light, called CeeLite, is as thin as a credit card and comes in sheets that can be cut, twisted and wrapped around other objects. Light emitting capacitor technology uses phosphors to make the sheets glow.

"Until it's integrated into something else it's not a finished product," said Evo-Lite president David Brooks. "It's allowing us to put lighting where never before imagined."

Evo-Lite and the CeeLight have been gaining recognition in Colorado over the past year, by inking agreements with Arby's, the Denver Grand Prix and local architecture firms, Brooks said.
