Christopher M. Cashman of **Protez Pharmaceuticals**, a Malvern, Pa., developer of antibiotics to combat drug resistance, was named Life Sciences CEO of the Year.

**Laureate Pharma Inc.**, a contract manufacturer based in Princeton, N.J., was named Emerging Life Sciences Company.
